The 2021 call for MSCA PF is expected to open shortly. It is going to be a busy summer for you.

Let us help you understand the forms and three evaluation criteria: (1) excellence, (2) impact and (3) quality and efficiency of the implementation.

You need to work closely with your supervisor as it is generally recommended that the proposal is submitted by her/him using the host organisation's PIC number.

Your trainers are:

Dr Katarzyna Skowrońska-Dzierzba – who works at the University's Grants office – and will support you and your supervisor in grant preparation. She will provide you with all the information related to the University and general grant requirements.

Jowita Chojcan, Horizon Europe programme expert, who has provided support in grants writing for many years. Her main expertise lies in individual grants awarded by the EU and other international grant agencies. As part of the network of National Contact Points that offers support to researchers applying for EU funding, she is responsible for providing grant support (incl. Euraxess) in the Lower Silesia region of Poland.

Dr Tomasz Hadaś - a post-doc at the Institute of Navigation in Stuttgart and associate professor at the Wroclaw University of Environmental and Life Sciences. His main scientific interest is satellite geodesy. He has been an MSCA fellow since 2019 and previously received scholarships from the Polish Ministry of Science and Higher Education for outstanding achievements as a young scientist. He has plenty of experience in research projects and serves as a technical officer for the European GNSS Agency (GSA).
